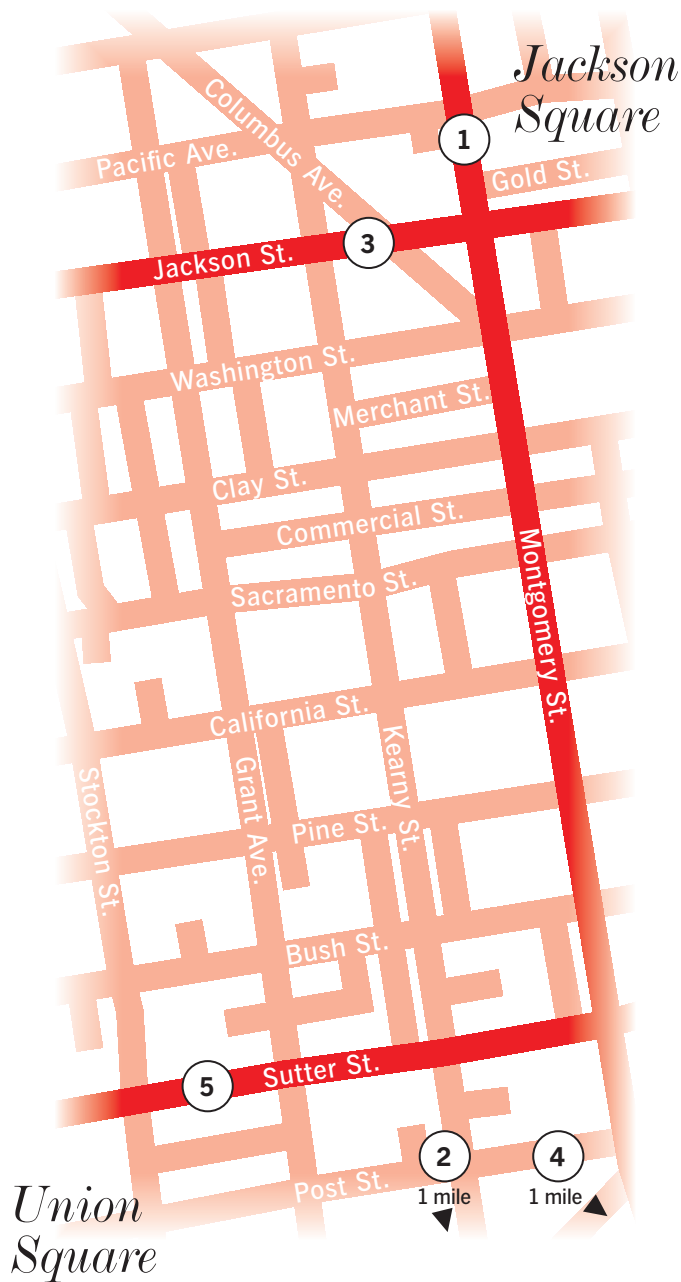


## Jackson Square & Union Square



**1. Carrots** Fittingly, this six-month-old endeavor lives in a space that used to house a restaurant—the one, in fact, where Alfred Hitchcock filmed scenes from *Vertigo*. The items on display pay homage to that period of polished sophistication, which is reflected in the Thakoon cocktail dresses and tailored Yigal Azrouël jackets. **843 Montgomery St., 415-834-9040**

**2. Chariots on Fire** Hidden behind frosted garage doors in an otherwise boutique-less stretch of the city, Chariots on Fire is an unparalleled resource for jewelry you'd be hard-pressed to locate anywhere else on the West Coast. **3. Eden & Eden** Filling a pie-shaped wedge on a sunny corner, Eden & Eden is devoted to goods from Britain, including Tatty Devine necklaces cast after giant zippers, Rococo teal goblets, and fluorescent yellow wallpaper reproductions of bus schedules.
