- 1. Anthropologie** The Beverly Hills outpost of Anthropologie has the best selection of exquisite flea-market-esque home goods, as well as picks from its exclusive collaborations, including vintage-inspired slipdresses from Some Odd Rubies and Anna Sui's decadently printed blouses. **320 N. - 2. Barneys New York** This New York-based fashion emporium has a well-earned reputation for discovering some of fashion's biggest stars. There are loads of lines here that are hard to find even in some of the most progressive local boutiques, like Surface to Air and Fifth Avenue Shoe Repair. **9570 Wilshire Blvd., 310-276-4400, barneys.com**
- 3. Club Monaco** An unparalleled resource for fuss-free, slightly mod blouses and well-cut pants, this retailer has an appropriately clean-lined, sweeping space in Beverly Hills. There's also a small range of home goods that abide by the same aesthetic. **401 N. Beverly Dr., 310-858-0204; plus other locations**
- 4. Cusp** Even though it's the younger and hipper spin-off of one of the most famous department stores in the world (Neiman Marcus), every Cusp maintains an under-the-radar, boutique-like feel. There are only five in the U.S., each offering a curated selection of indie labels like 3.1 Phillip Lim, Tehya, and Tea & Honey. **10250 Santa Monica Blvd., 310-552-0300, cusp.com**
- 5. and 6. Gucci** There are three Guccis in Los Angeles—two are close to each other on Rodeo, which means that between the pair you can get a full dose of hyper-sexy gold-heeled stilettos and vintage floral-print-blanketed handbags. **220 N. - 7. James Perse** This always-excellent resource for super-soft T-shirts and tanks has its roots in Los Angeles, though there are now eight stores across the country (including four in California). A calm and low-key vibe prevails; the wares are in soothing black, white, and gray, and all of the stores are kitted out in bamboo. **357 N. - 8. Louis Vuitton** The futuristic Rodeo Drive branch of this iconic fashion house commands the most traffic, but we prefer the slightly more obscure Century City location. It's exclusively devoted to

accessories, which means there's ample room for the raspberry-hued Epi leather Speedy bags. **10250 Santa Monica Blvd., 310-551-0090**

9. Madewell Slightly less preppy silhouettes are mainstays at this J.Crew spin-off, like skinny jeans in tons of colorful washes; super-long, paper-thin cardigans; and kookily patterned tanks and scarves. **10250 Santa Monica Blvd., 310-772-0428, madewell1937.com**

10. Maison Martin Margiela One of the pioneers behind deconstructed, challenging clothing, Martin Margiela focuses on expertly tailored pieces in a monochromatic palette. He has

more than 10 gallery-like freestanding shops around the world, including his space in Beverly Hills, which is coolly bare and industrial. **9970 S. Santa Monica Blvd., 310-284-8093, maisonmartinmargiela.com**

- 11. Miu Miu** Prada's sister store is slightly more moderately priced, and just a touch more offbeat, than the original line. Expect cap-sleeved gowns in acid green, tops crafted from orange neoprene, and loads of cool ruched leather bags. **317 N. Rodeo Dr., 310-247-2227**
- 12. Neiman Marcus** At five floors and 180,000 square feet, Neiman Marcus is a mecca for those in search of a huge array of designers (from Derek Lam to Rag & Bone). There is also an unparalleled shoe department, featuring elegant Manolo Blahnik stilettos and a slew of Chanel flats. **9700 Wilshire Blvd., 310-550-5900, neimanmarcus.com**
- 13. Prada** It's almost as much about the Scheeren Ole and Rem Koolhaas-designed building (its exterior walls undulate in a way that

makes them look like sails) as it is about the goods. But these are equally impressive, from the so-nerdy-they're-cool eyeglasses to flower-festooned skirts. **343 N. Rodeo Dr., 310-278-8661, prada.com**

14. Saks Fifth Avenue A tony Beverly Hills address is a fitting backdrop for this beautifully appointed flagship: All the fashion essentials (and nonessentials) are here, including lush evening gowns from Pucci, beach-appropriate Shoshanna caftans, and tons of denim. **9600 Wilshire Blvd., 310-275-4211, saks.com**

15. Switch Beverly Hills might be known more for über-luxe shopping than small, independent brands, but this space is adding loads of up-and-comers to the neighborhood. Choose from delicately crafted Rodnik blouses and chiffon dresses from Hanii Y. **238 S. Beverly Dr., 310-860-1650**

YSL Overseen by designer Stefano Pilati, the accessories at this renowned French label are as spot-on and sexy as ever (think teetering platform heels and wide crocodile belts), and they're well represented at this lavishly appointed location—along with the complete collection of clothing. **326 N.
