- 1. John Derian** Occupying a shed-like building behind Derian's own summer house, this two-room shop looks a bit like the combination of a surf shack and the living room of an eccentric aunt. In addition to Derian's decoupage plates and the hand-glazed Astier de Villatte ceramic pitchers, there are loads of beach-friendly items too, such as sari-esque picnic blankets and rugged canvas carryalls. **396 Commercial St., 508-487-1362**
- 2. Marc by Marc Jacobs** Marc Jacobs president Robert Duffy loves Provincetown, which is why the tiny hamlet's main street hosts a Marc by Marc Jacobs boutique. Besides the fun dollar-store fare the stores are now known for (plastic lipstick-shaped pens, glittery cocktail rings), this is an excellent resource for items you forgot to pack: flip-flops, bikinis, and featherweight cashmere sweaters, as well as greatest hits from the current collection. **184 Commercial St., 508-487-0723**
- 3. Small Pleasures** With one of the best selections of antique estate jewelry we've ever seen, this hushed and dark parlor-like salon is an unlikely beach-town find.
